As a reviewer, you describe the book, analyze how the book achieved its purpose, and express your own reactions. Times New Roman 12pt**

The following information is needed in the HEADING:

Title

Author

Name of Publisher & Copyright Date of book (year only)

ISBN Number: **(only use the ASIN# if the ISBN# is unavailable)**

Reviewed by (your name) for Reader Views (month/year of review)

Number of Stars* (1-5) and Headline for review (3 to 5 words)

BODY OF THE REVIEW:

The body of the review is a minimum of 350 words, usually 3 - 5 paragraphs. When referencing the title in the body of the review please put in quotations, for example, “book title.” The first part of the review should include a BRIEF summary of the book. The rest of the review should contain your opinions about the book.

CONCLUSION:

The conclusion ties together the review and summarizes your overall opinion.

Consider these questions when writing your review

- What is the author's main point or plot?
- How successful do you think the author was in carrying out the purpose of the publication?
- Characters – Did the author do a good job making the characters authentic? Did they feel like real people? Did you like the protagonist? Why or why not? Was the antagonist someone you loved to hate?
- Settings – Did the author paint a vivid picture in your mind of the surroundings? Did you feel like you were there?
- How well does the author write? You can use a brief quotation to illustrate your observations.
- Who is the book for? (general reader, genre interest, specialized audience, age range, orientation, etc.)
- Your personal experiences that relate to the topic. Your personal opinion. Your favorite part or what you learned.
- Your recommendation. This could pertain to editing issues, future publications, or story line.

Be creative! Give your own honest and FAIR opinion. Your writing should be **objective with *constructive* criticism if necessary**. No bashing or derogatory remarks.
